## POLITICAL ACTIVITIES OF EMPLOYEES

Employees have the full responsibilities of citizens living in a democracy including such citizen rights as voting; discussing the social, political, and economic issues of the day in public meetings; supporting candidates; accepting appointive or elective public office; or holding office in political parties.

## PERFORMANCE OF CIVIC DUTIES BY EMPLOYEES

Employees are encouraged to perform their civic duties which may include:

- 1. voting and taking an interest in the social, political, and economic issues of the day.
- 2. exercising democratic rights and responsibilities which are shared in common with other citizens. These rights and privileges may include
  - a. electioneering for candidates.
  - b. accepting positions in political campaigns.
  - c. holding an office in a political party organization.
  - d. serving as a delegate to political party conventions.

## INDIVIDUAL RESPONSIBILITY IN PARTICIPATING IN POLITICAL FUNCTIONS

Employees engaging in political activities shall

- 1. engage in no political activities on school and District premises during school and/or duty hours.
- 2. endeavor to make others realize that their utterances and actions are performed merely as individuals and not as representatives of the District or any educational program.
- 3. realize their primary obligation is to their work as employees.

## PERSONAL LEAVE FOR POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

Leaves of absence without pay for political activities may be granted for the purpose of being a candidate for political office or holding political office upon proper request and mutual agreement.
