GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS FOR STUDENTS WITHOUT RECORDS

Students entering the District from a high school or equivalent education program outside the District are expected to have a transcript of previous high school/program study. Credit will not be recorded without adequate documents of previous school experience. In the event that a student is not able to produce previous school records, the following criterion will apply:

Students are expected to complete a minimum of 115 units credit in residence.

Students are expected to complete:

English 40 units
Science 20 units
Math 20 units
Physical Education 20 units
Social Science 30 units
Health 2.5 units
World Language or 10 units

Visual/Performing Arts

Some of these the English units may be completed in English-as-a-second-language Language Development classes but should be so designated by the teachers.

The student shall pass the required competencies in reading, editing, writing, mathematics, and computers.

All students will be enrolled in freshman or entry-level classes and classified as a freshman. Students may be reclassified to another grade and re-enrolled in advanced classes based on successful performance (grade of "C" or better and teacher recommendation). Such reclassification may result in the waiver of credits requirement and the granting of credits, as determined by the principal.

Students may utilize all provisions of Regulation 5331 for establishing credit. Students who are 16 or older may utilize the State Proficiency Exam.
